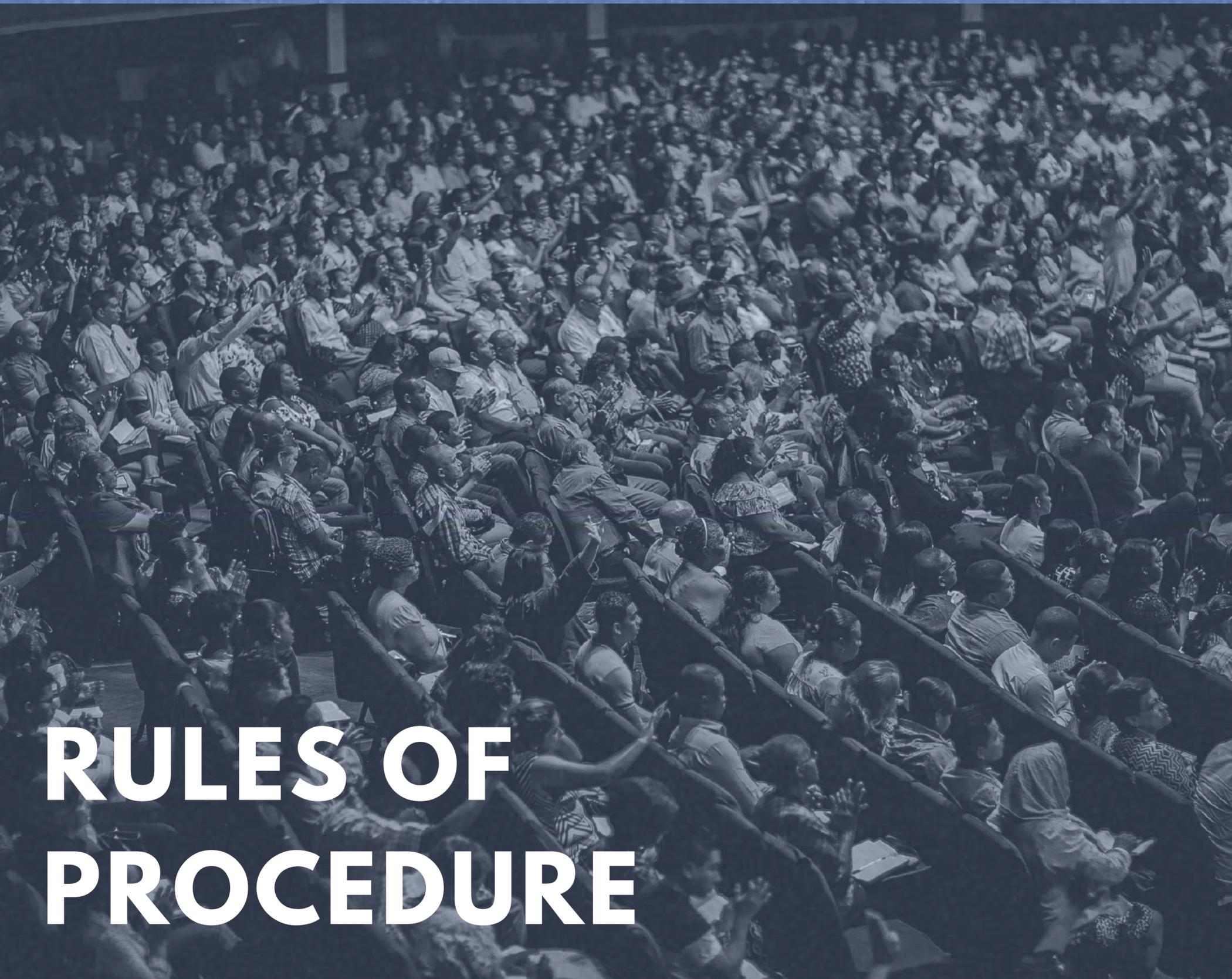

RULES OF PROCEDURE

FOR SYMBIMUN 2026

Power , Security & Rights



1. SCOPE OF APPLICATION

These Rules of Procedure (RoP) apply to all committees of the conference, which is conducted fully offline on 7th and 8th February 2026, unless explicitly stated otherwise.

2. DRESS CODE

1. During all official sessions of the conference (excluding socials), delegates must adhere to Western Business Attire:

- Male delegates: Suit (with or without tie at the discretion of the dais)
- Female delegates: Suit or business-appropriate formal dress

2. Wearing national or religious symbols of the represented nation is prohibited, unless the delegate is personally a part of that religion.

- National and UN pins are exempt
- Symbols not worn (e.g. pictures, flags, placards) are not exempt

3. THE SECRETARIAT

3.1 Secretaries-General

1. The Secretaries-General are the heads of the Secretariat.
2. They may make statements regarding:
 - The debate
 - Current events within the conference reality
 - Agenda items
3. at any time, or may appoint members of the Secretariat to do so on their behalf.

4. THE CRISIS TEAM

1. The Crisis Team is responsible for:

- Approving, answering, partially approving, or declining directives
- Managing the crisis timeline and outcomes

2. The Crisis Team shall publish official news through means announced by the dais.

1. Delegates may only refer to conference-issued news and may not refer to real-world events occurring after 7 February 2026.

1. UNSC and DISEC are designated Crisis Committees.

1. Directives may be:

- Joint
- Delegation-based

6. Failed directives may still result in partial or unintended consequences at the discretion of the Crisis Team.

5. THE DIAS

1. Each committee is chaired by:

- A Chair (President)
- A Rapporteur

2. jointly referred to as the Dais.

3. The Dais:

- Conducts debate and voting
- Interprets and enforces the RoP at its discretion

4. The Dais may temporarily suspend the Rules of Procedure if required to ensure the proper functioning of the committee.

5. The Dais may bar a delegate from:

- Speaking
- Caucusing
- Remaining in committee

6. due to repeated breaches of decorum or diplomatic conduct.

6. ROLL CALL

1. Prior to every session, the Rapporteur conducts a roll call.

2. Delegations shall respond as:

- Present
- Present and voting
- Absent

3. Delegates may change their status during the session by informing the dais in writing.

4. After roll call, the dais announces:

- Quorum
- Required majorities

7. QUORUM & MAJORITIES

1. Each delegation has one vote and may not vote on behalf of another.

1. **Simple Majority:**

50% of delegates present + 1 (rounded down if not an integer)

3. **Two-Thirds Majority:**

Two-thirds of delegates present + 1 (rounded down if not an integer)

4. **Abstentions are permitted** in substantive votes and do not count towards the majority calculation

8. FLOW OF DEBATE

1. After the first roll call, the committee enters agenda setting.

2. If no agenda is set by motion by the end of the first day, it is adopted in the order of the Background Guide.

3. Once the agenda is set, the committee moves directly into debate on the agenda items.

4. Each agenda item consists of:

- Debate
- Voting procedure

9. SPEECHES & SPEAKERS' LIST

1. During debate, delegates may take the floor to give substantive speeches.
2. Speeches must be addressed to the chair.
3. Speech time:
 - Minimum: 60 seconds
 - Maximum: 90 seconds
4. The Speakers' List:
 - Opens at the beginning of debate
 - Is erased when moving to a new agenda item
5. A speaker may yield remaining time to:
 - The Chair
 - Another delegate (once only)
 - Questions (maximum 2 questions)
6. Interruptions during speeches are strictly prohibited.

10. CAUCUSES

10.1 Moderated Caucus

1. Used for focused, short interventions on a specific sub-topic.

1. Requires:

- A motion
- A simple majority

2. The motion must specify:

- Topic
- Total time
- Speaking time per delegate

10.2 Unmoderated Caucus

3. Used for informal discussion and resolution writing.

4. Requires:

- A motion
- A simple majority

5. The motion must specify duration.

11. POINTS

Points do not require a vote and are entertained immediately.

Allowed points:

1. Point of Information to the Chair
 2. Point of Information to the Speaker (if questions are yielded)
 3. Point of Order
 4. Right of Reply
- Granted at the discretion of the chair
 - Must be submitted as a written statement for approval

12. MOTIONS

10.1 Moderated Caucus

1. Used for focused, short interventions on a specific sub-topic.

1. Requires:

- A motion
- A simple majority

2. The motion must specify:

- Topic
- Total time
- Speaking time per delegate

10.2 Unmoderated Caucus

3. Used for informal discussion and resolution writing.

4. Requires:

- A motion
- A simple majority

5. The motion must specify duration.

13. VOTING PROCEDURE

1. Upon closure of debate, the committee immediately enters voting procedure.
2. During voting:
 - No entry or exit is permitted
 - No breaks are allowed
3. Voting proceeds in the following order:
 - Amendments
 - Division of the Question
 - Draft Resolution as a whole

14. RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolutions are the final output of the conference.
2. Pre-written resolutions are strictly prohibited.
3. Working papers become draft resolutions only after dais approval.
4. Resolution merging is strongly encouraged.
5. Chairs may:
 - Suggest mergers
 - Refuse to table redundant draft resolutions

15. AMENDMENTS

1. Amendments may:

- Add
- Strike
- Reorder operative clauses

2. Friendly amendments require unanimous sponsor approval.

3. Unfriendly amendments require committee approval through voting.

16. SECURITY COUNCIL – SPECIAL RULES

1. UNSC requires:

- Minimum 9 members present, including permanent members

2. Procedural and substantive votes require 9 votes in favour.

3. Substantive votes require no veto from permanent members.

4. Permanent members may raise a motion to declare a vote substantive.

17. DECORUM & DIPLOMATIC CONDUCT

1. Decorum & Diplomatic Conduct

2. Delegates must remain:

- Attentive
- Respectful
- Silent when not speaking

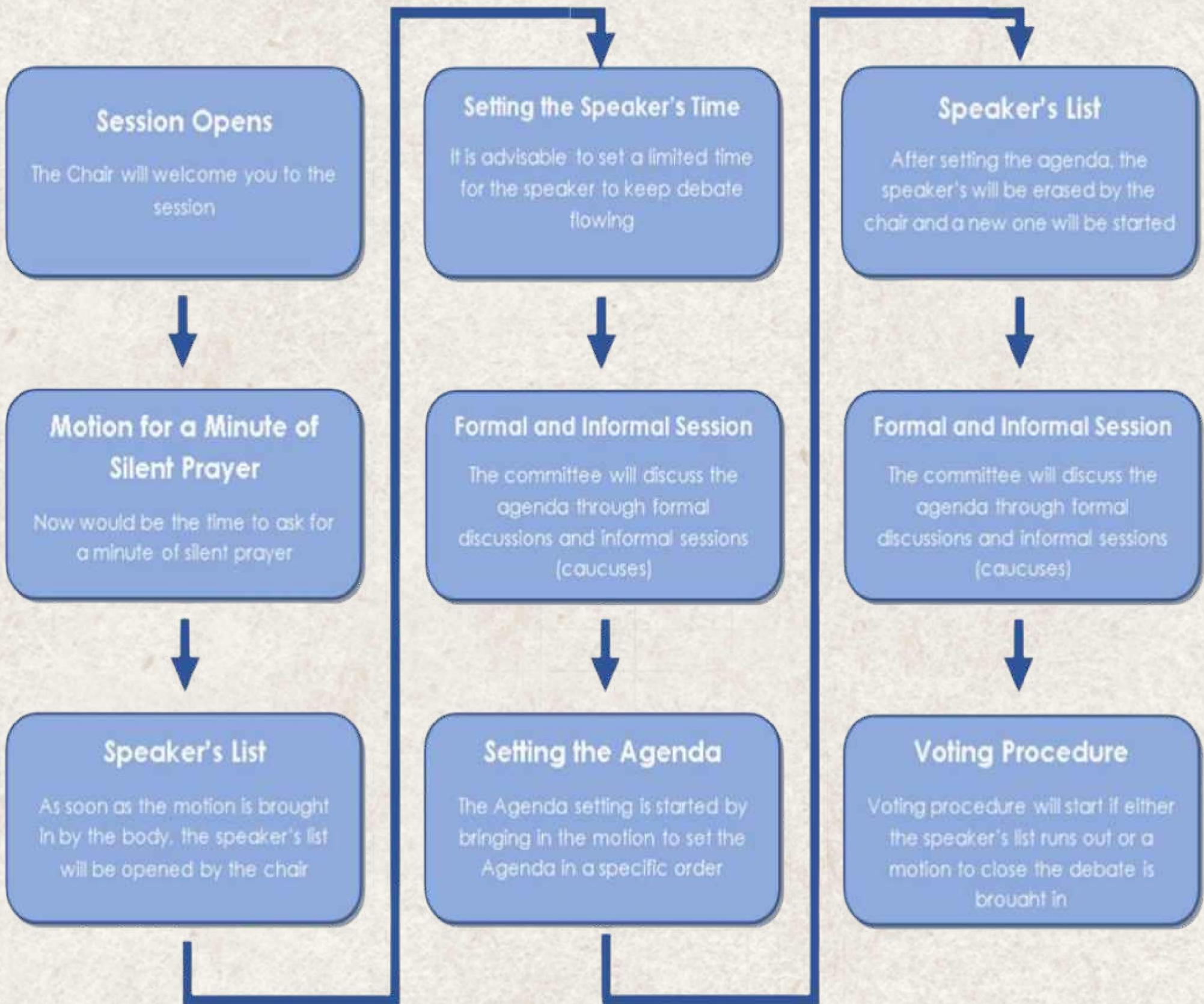
3. Applause, displays of disapproval, or informal reactions are prohibited.

4. Delegates must use formal diplomatic language at all times.

5. Repeated violations may result in:

- Warnings
- Loss of speaking rights
- Removal from committee
